We are committed to providing an environment that embodies the three principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi – Protection, Partnership, and Participation – which embraces the biculturalism of Aotearoa as well as the multiculturalism of Waiheke Island. We collaborate with tamariki, whānau, and the community to create a sense of ako – reciprocal learning.
